Visitor Services Project Stehekin

Report Summary

- This report describes the results of a visitor study at Stehekin during August 25-31, 1991. A total of 362 questionnaires were distributed and 299 returned, an 83% response rate.
- This report profiles Stehekin/Lake Chelan National Recreation Area visitors. Stehekin is part of the North Cascades National Park Complex and is referred to as "Stehekin" or "the park." A separate appendix has visitors' comments about Stehekin and their visit. A summary of these comments is included in this report and the appendix.
- Visitors were commonly families (61%); often in groups of two (42%) or four (22%). Forty-four percent of visitors were 31-50 years old. Most (68%) were first time visitors to Stehekin.
- Visitors from foreign countries comprised 1% of the total visitation. Americans came from Washington (65%) and Oregon (10%), with smaller numbers from other states.
- Fifty-seven percent of the visitors spent one day or more in the park. Most visitors went sightseeing (85%), visited the museum/information center (73%) and went dayhiking (53%). Stehekin Landing was the most visited site (94%) in the park, followed by Rainbow Falls (66%).
- Most visitors (93%) entered the park at Stehekin Landing. Many reasons brought visitors to the park, but most often identified was the scenery/natural setting (78%).
- The tour boats were the most frequently used arrival and departure transportation, with 97% of the visitors using one or both of the boats. While at Stehekin/Lake Chelan, visitors used the NPS shuttle bus (32%) and walking (29%) to get around.
- Over half of the visitors were aware of the shuttle bus (58%) and the camping (53%) reservation systems. Their most common sources of information on the reservation systems were friends/relatives, the Golden West Visitor Center and previous visits.
- The most used services were the Golden West Visitor Center, information from boat ranger, shuttle bus, free/sales publications and outside exhibits/bulletin boards. The shuttle bus, free/sales publications and information from Stehekin resident were the most useful services. Outside exhibits/bulletin boards and boat time program received the highest somewhat useful to not useful ratings.
- Most visitors (58%) stayed overnight in Stehekin/Lake Chelan NRA. The largest proportion stayed at the North Cascades Lodge cabins (40%). They made many additional comments.
